PSALM 109 (110)

Until I make thy enemies * thy footstool.

The Lord will send forth the sceptre of thy power out of Sion: * rule thou in the midst of thy enemies. With thee is the principality in the day of thy strength: in the brightness of the saints: * from the womb before the day star I begot thee.

The Lord hath sworn, and he will not repent: * Thou art a priest for ever according to the order of Melchisedech. The Lord at thy right hand * hath broken kings in the day of his wrath.

He shall judge among nations, he shall fill ruins: * he shall crush the heads in the land of many. He shall drink of the torrent in the way: * therefore shall he lift up the head.

All his commandments are faithful: confirmed for ever and ever, * made in truth and equity. He hath sent redemption to his people: * he hath commanded his covenant for ever.

(bow head) Holy and terrible is his name: * the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. A good understanding to all that do it: * his praise continueth for ever and ever.

Acceptable is the man that sheweth mercy and lendeth: he shall order his words with judgement: * because he shall not be moved for ever. The just shall be in everlasting remembrance: * he shall not fear the evil hearing.

His heart is ready to hope in the Lord: his heart is strengthened, * he shall not be moved until he look over his enemies. He hath distributed, he hath given to the poor: his justice remaineth for ever and ever: * his horn shall be exalted in glory.

The wicked shall see, and shall be angry, he shall gnash with his teeth and pine away: * the desire of the wicked shall perish. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. **As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.**

PSALM 112 (113)

From the rising of the sun unto the going down of the same, * the name of the Lord is worthy of praise. The Lord is high above all nations; * and his glory above the heavens.

Who is as the Lord our God, who dwelleth on high: * and looketh down on the low things in heaven and in earth? Raising up the needy from the earth, * and lifting up the poor out of the dunghill:

That he may place him with princes, * with the princes of his people. Who maketh a barren woman to dwell in a house, * the joyful mother of children.

PSALM 113 (114)

The sea saw and fled: * Jordan was turned back. The mountains skipped like rams, * and the hills like the lambs of the flock.

What ailed thee, O thou sea, that thou didst flee: * and thou, O Jordan, that thou wast turned back? Ye mountains, that ye skipped like rams, * and ye hills, like lambs of the flock?

At the presence of the Lord the earth was moved, * at the presence of the God of Jacob: Who turned the rock into pools of water, * and the stony hill into fountains of waters.

Not to us, O Lord, not to us; * but to thy name give glory. For thy mercy, and for thy truth's sake: * lest the Gentiles should say: Where is their God?

But our God is in heaven: * he hath done all things whatsoever he would. The idols of the Gentiles are silver and gold, * the works of the hands of men.

May the Lord add blessings upon you: * upon you, and upon your children. Blessed be you of the Lord, * who made heaven and earth.

The heaven of heaven is the Lord's: * but the earth he has given to the children of men. The dead shall not praise thee, O Lord: * nor any of them that go down to hell.
